## Fast Facts



- MCSPCA rescued and cared for over to 4,000 lost, neglected or abused animals in 2009. Over 364 were reunited with their human companions and more than 2,400 were adopted into new homes. MCSPCA receives no federal or state financial assistance. It relies primarily upon the generosity of donors.
- Monmouth County has no municipal shelter. MCSPCA houses and cares for the county's homeless pets and coordinates the rescue of injured wildlife rescue. Last year alone MCSPCA responded to 571 cases involving injured wildlife.
- As part of our charter, close to 800 animal cruelty complaints are investigated annually by the MCSPCA Humane Law Enforcement Division.
- The MCSPCA Humane Education Program reaches over 6,500 young people with a message of compassion, animal safety, responsibility and respect for others.
- The MCSPCA Pet Therapy Program brings the healing power of pets to the homebound, special needs children and adults living in nursing homes.
- The MCSPCA Vogel Animal Care Center, located at the Shelter, provides low cost spay/neutering services to the public. Animal population control is a key to preventing animal cruelty and neglect. Last year MCSPCA spay/neutered 5,293 pets.
- The MCSPCA provides additional services to the community with pet assistance/housing to victims of domestic violence, financial hardship and natural disasters.
- The MCSPCA recently completed a \$6M state of the art facility renovation placing the organization into the forefront of the New Jersey animal welfare community.
